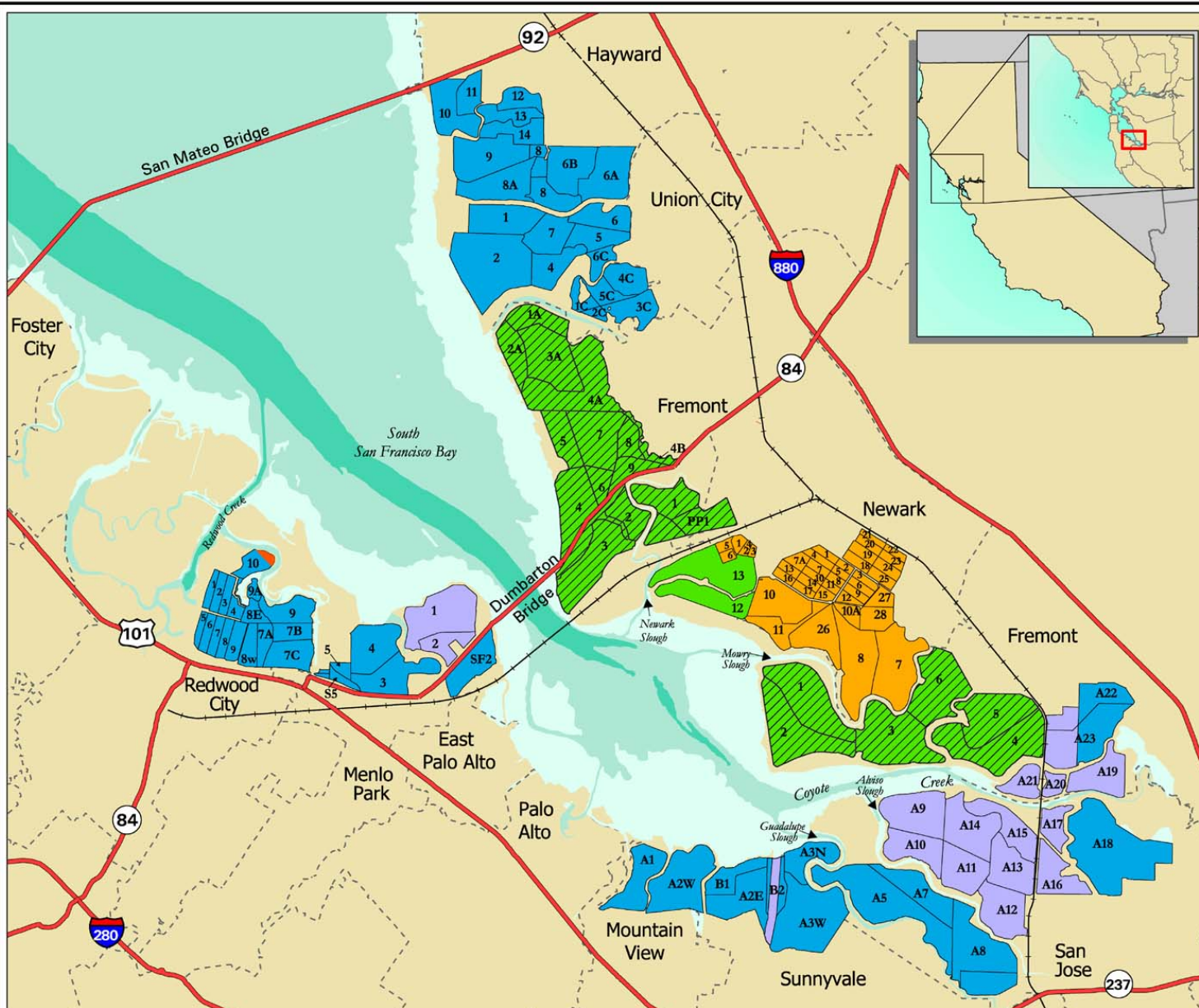


# May 3, Areas Cargill Proposed for Sale, 1999 and 2000

This map shows the two proposals Cargill has made to sell its lands and/or mineral rights for habitat restoration. In 1999, Cargill proposed 22,720 acres (87%) for restoration and 3,470 acres (13%) retained in salt production. In 2000, Cargill proposed 15,880 acres (61%) for restoration and 10,310 acres (39%) retained in salt production. The differing 6,840 acres are Refuge lands previously designated for habitat restoration but currently proposed for continued salt production. Note also that 3,920 acres (25%) of Cargill's current "lands for sale" are public lands on which Cargill holds only the mineral rights for salt production.
